

On this basis, the formation of urban folklore takes place — a part of the folklore heritage, which includes, in addition to the commonly used types and genres of folk poetry, specific urban «modifications» of them. For example: urban folk festivities, urban romance, urban game songs and dances. The formation and development of various social groups is taking place, which produce their specific forms of folklore creativity (folklore of students, intelligentsia, bourgeoisie, workers, etc.). Considerable rates of development are observed in the field of «urban primitive» (according to H. S. Ostrovsky): bourgeois portrait, signboard, home decorative painting, etc.

Urban folklore (primitive) differs from the oral traditions of the rural peasantry that preceded it. And this is quite understandable: life in the city is radically different from the agricultural tradition. The perception of the world changes, and ultimately the worldview of a person, that is, the picture of the world.

First of all, it is non-ideological, since the main ideological needs of the townspeople are satisfied in other ways that are not related to oral traditions (mass literature, cinema and other spectacles, mass media products, etc.). In addition, urban folklore is fragmented according to social, professional, clan, age stratification of society, which do not have a common worldview basis.

In addition, such components of national artistic culture as a national holiday are receiving new interpretations. If in the peasant subculture the holiday still retained a sacred meaning, then in the city the sacredness is gradually disappearing: the city transforms rural traditional (sacred) rites into simple amusements and fun. The national holiday in urban conditions takes on new features: new traditions emerge (for example, the celebration of the New Year was a city tradition for a long time; in the countryside, the celebration of Christmas was treated more respectfully); a new corpus of game songs and dances is being formed; there is a tradition of urban folk festivities.

One of the strata of the folk culture of the city, where the transformations, both functional and aesthetic, were most clearly reflected, is the multivariate system of decorative and applied art. In the conditions of the city, the role of decorative and applied art changes radically, but this is a separate topic.

PICTURESQUE PLACES OF UKRAINE AS TOURISM-RECREATION

Going on vacation, we want to spend it interesting. For some it is enough to just sit at home and finally get some sleep, for some it is an excuse to travel and discover something new. Of course, there are many interesting places in the world, but there are more than enough of them in our country. The peaks of the Carpathian Mountains to the plains along the Black Sea are a treasure trove of history, culture and breathtaking landscape. Ukraine is more than just its size, it is a country painted with a palette of diverse geographical features, imagine hills covered with golden fields of wheat interspersed with deep mysterious forests, images of rocky mountain ranges, their peaks covered with snow, standing guard over the land, which has seen the passage of centuries, and let's not forget the quiet rivers that snake through the country, their banks decorated with bright colors of Ukrainian flora, but the charm of Ukraine extends not only to its physical beauty, but also to its culture, steeped in tradition and history, as well as fascinating as its landscape. This is a country where folk tales come to life.

In order not to be verbose, we will tell you about several unique places where you should go on tours in Ukraine.

1) One of the first places to see is the Mukachevo Castle, a famous fortress that towers proudly above the city. The foundation of the castle was an ancient volcanic mountain, and the city itself was built later, precisely around this magnificent fortress, in which people hid from the raids of numerous enemies.

2) Bus tours in Ukraine are simply impossible without a trip to Rivne. True romantics must see here one of the most beautiful places — the famous Tunnel of Love. The green tunnel, which has grown around the old railway track, is simply an ideal place for walks and photo sessions with your significant other, because it is extremely beautiful at any time of the year.

The Shatsky Lakes are located in the northwestern part of Ukraine, and are a whole protected area. Here, in the national natural park, among thick mixed and pine forests, tourists can see more than 30 of the most beautiful lakes. The most famous and popular of them is the famous Svityaz.

3) Excursion tours in Ukraine from Kyiv cannot be imagined without visiting one more unique attraction — Ancient Tustan. Ancient, powerful and atmospheric, the Tustan fortress today attracts many tourists from all over the country, and in addition, a historical festival is held here every year with knightly battles and atmospheric musical performances.

4) Located in the Kherson region, the Askania Nova reserve is a real pristine corner, the lands of which have never been cultivated by humans. Created in the 19th century, the modern reserve includes a dendrological park, a steppe and a zoo. Excursions here will especially appeal to children, who will be able to see animals in their natural habitat.

5) The real highlight of the Carpathians, and certainly the most beautiful lake in the whole country, Synevyr is worth going on a weekend tour of Ukraine, and going right here — to one of the most beautiful regions of Transcarpathia — Mizhhirya. The nature in the vicinity of this miracle is simply stunning, originally beautiful, and the Synevyr National Park is located nearby — just a great place for walks and rafting on the fast rivers of the Black River and Tereblya.

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6) «Oleshky sands» is a unique nature reserve, the second largest sandy desert in Europe, located in the Kherson region in the south of Ukraine. The sands impress with their beauty and uniqueness of the landscape: endless open spaces covered with sand, which dynamically transform under the influence of the wind, creating unique landscapes.

7) The Lemurian lake, known as the «pink lake» or the Kherson «Dead Sea», is one of the natural wonders of the Kherson region, located near the village of Hryhoriv. When looking at the map to find the location of the pink lake, it is noticeable that there is a large reservoir nearby — Syvash. They are separated by a thin strip of land. Pink Lake has become a popular destination for tourists and photographers who come to enjoy the natural beauty of this object and take unique photos.

The lake impresses with its pink water color, which is formed due to the large number of specific species of Dunaliella algae and bacteria. This is a natural phenomenon, so the shade may change depending on environmental conditions.

8) The «Optymistychna» cave is located in the Ternopil region and is considered the longest gypsum cave in the world, which is why it was even entered into the Guinness Book of Records. In the underground world of this unique place, there is an exciting atmosphere that cannot be conveyed with the help of photos. Excursion bureaus offer different levels of complexity of itineraries — from ordinary educational to more extreme ones.

During the excursion, tourists will be able to take a good look at gypsum crystals of various shapes, sizes and colors. This sight becomes especially mesmerizing under the light of flashlights, when the crystals begin to shimmer, glow and seem to change their shape.

9) Sofiivka National Dendrological Park is one of the best examples of park art and landscape design in Ukraine with an area of 179.6 hectares. Located in the city of Uman, Cherkasy region, this park attracts visitors with its beauty, diversity of flora and history. Sofiivka Park is famous for its unique landscape design. Elements of English garden art, stylized figures, lawns, ponds and architectural compositions are found here. The natural object is a real treasure for botanists and plant lovers. Various trees, shrubs and flower compositions from all over the world are presented here. One of the remarkable features of the park is that it is built around the Kamianka River, and cascades, waterfalls, ponds, water features are arranged along the riverbed, creating unparalleled landscapes.

10) The Ukrainian Carpathians are part of the Eastern Carpathian Mountain system in Western Ukraine. The Ukrainian Carpathians are rich with mineral waters, on the basis of which balneological resorts were formed in many places of the region. In spring and summer, here you can not only breathe fresh mountain air, but also enjoy the wonderful and diverse blooming mountain nature. The mountains are also undoubtedly magical in winter. Therefore, if you are not afraid of minus temperatures, then there is an opportunity to see beautiful and very picturesque landscapes.
